- Notes Pertaining to the Curriculum:**
- No courses taken for the business degree may be taken Pass-Not Pass (only non-business free electives may be P-NP).
 - Courses are monitored for prerequisite requirements. All prerequisites will be enforced.
 - * BUSEC majors will take MATH 160 and ECON 207 after transfer. ACSCI majors will take MAT 210 and MAT 216 instead of Discrete Math and Calculus for Business.
 - ^ STAT 226 is required for ACCT, ACSCI, BUSAN, BUSEC, and FIN majors. If MATH 156 and MAT 161 are both taken they will substitute for STAT 226. MAT 156 or MAT 161 can be a substitute for ENTSP, MGMT, MIS, MKT and SCM majors.
 - # With the exception of ACCT 285, pre-business students cannot take Professional Program courses.
 - % MGMT 478 must be taken in the senior year, and requires completion of all business core classes, with the exception of MGMT 372.

Pre-business students must apply for admission to the Professional Program.
Requirements: Completion of at least 30 credits, all Foundation courses, all ENGL 99 and 101 courses (if required), and ENGL 150; Cumulative or Foundation GPA of 2.50. Early Admission to Professional Program approved for Cumulative GPA of 3.50 and completion of all ENGL 99 and 101 courses (if required), all Foundation courses must still be completed before graduation. (See your advisor for specific information.)

- Other Special Notes:**
1. Minimum of 122 credits total; (131 for ACSCI)
 2. 42 credits of 300-level or higher coursework from a four-year institution;
 3. Grade of “C” or better in at least 30 credits applied to the Business Core and major;
 4. 50% of required business courses must be earned at Iowa State University;
 5. The last 32 credits applied to a degree must be taken at ISU (exceptions for study abroad and internship may be requested);
 6. All 300-level and higher business credits must be earned at a four-year college;
 7. No more than 16 credits in vocational-technical courses can be applied to a bachelor’s degree;
 8. No more than 65 credits earned at two-year institutions can be applied to a bachelor’s degree;
 9. Completion of an AA degree at an Iowa Community College will cover most general education courses. Students will be required to take business communication, INTL/Global perspective courses, U.S. Diversity course, and library to complete general education requirements.
