#### PRACTICAL WORK EXPERIENCE

The NREM program requires all undergraduate students to complete a practical work experience –NREM 104. This is a non-credit requirement which may be completed prior to attending ISU (but after graduation from high school). Typically, this involves 400 hours of work in a career related position. The intent is to give students a better idea of the employment opportunities and conditions in the field of natural resources. We offer placement assistance for students looking to complete this requirement.
