Additional Graduation Requirements:

- 1. Minimum of 122 credits total.
- 42 credits of 300-level or higher coursework from a four-year institution.
- Grade of "C or better" in ENGL 250 and grade of "C or better" in ENGL 150 or ENGL 302.
- Grade of "C or better" in at least 30 credits applied to Business Core and major.
- 50% of required business courses must be earned at lowa State University. All 300-level and higher business courses must be earned at a four-year college or university.
- 6. No more than 2 transfer classes can be applied to the major.
- Last 32 credits applied to a degree must be taken at lowa State University (exceptions for study abroad and internship may be requested).
- 8. Cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 with no Quality Point Deficiencies,
- Multiple business majors must have at least 15 distinct credits in each. When applicable, one course can be shared between business majors. (See your advisor regarding multiple business degree requirements).
- 10. No more than 16 credits in vocational-technical courses can be applied to a bachelor's degree.
- 11. No more than 65 credits earned at two-year institutions can be applied to a bachelor's degree.
- 12. Completion of an AA degree at an Iowa CC will cover most general education courses. Students will be required to take business communication, INTL/Global perspective courses, U.S. Diversity course, and library to complete general education requirements.

Notes Pertaining to the Curriculum:

- No courses taken for the business degree can be taken Pass-Not Pass (only non-business "free" electives may be taken P-NP).
- Business course prerequisites are monitored and will be enforced.
- BBA majors- see BBA specific transfer guide.
- * BUSEC majors will take MATH 160 and ECON 207 after transfer. ACSCI majors will take MAT 211 and MAT 217 instead of Finite Math and Calculus for Business.
