## EXERCISE SCIENCE MAJOR TRANSFER PLANNING GUIDE DES MOINES AREA COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Based on the Iowa State University 2023 – 2024 Catalog Updated November 2023

The <u>Kinesiology and Health major</u> involves the biological and behavioral study of physical activity and its impact on health, society, and the quality of life. The <u>Exercise Science option</u> focuses on the study of exercise prescription and how the body responds to various types of exercise.

This transfer plan is based on the Exercise Science Transfer Major designed by the Iowa Department of Education.

#### Important notes:

- Students will be required to follow the Exercise Science <u>academic plan</u>. Courses can be met prior to transferring and once at Iowa State. All courses need to be taken in order to earn a Bachelor Science degree.
- How to read this transfer plan:
  - Community college curriculum (prior to transfer).
    - Community college courses, in addition to their Iowa State equivalents, are listed.
    - The Iowa State equivalents can be compared to the courses on the sample academic plan.
  - Iowa State curriculum (after transferring).
    - The sample curriculum provided is what a student would tentatively take after transferring to Iowa State.
  - Course Suggestions
    - Courses are listed that will meet community college and Iowa State requirements.
    - Use this to choose humanities, social sciences, electives, etc.
- Larger credit loads and/or summer classes may be required at lowa State. This will depend on what has been completed, and will be evaluated on an individual basis with the assistance of an lowa State advisor.
- Iowa State advisors will work closely with students to identify any courses that still need to be taken. Depending on what was taken at the community college, most courses will already be met. In other cases, some requirements may need to be added if courses on the sample plan are not met with previous transfer work.
- No more than 65 semester credit hours can be transferred from a community college. Iowa State will accept up to 16 semester hours of credit earned in vocational-technical courses if the sending community college accepts such courses toward its Associate in Art or Associate in Science degrees.
- This document was accurate on the date it was prepared, but may not reflect subsequent changes by Iowa State or this community college. For this reason, this transfer plan should not replace close contact with an advisor at your community college and/or Iowa State.

\*Summer courses: To stay on track for a 2-year graduation plan, Iowa State advisors suggest at least 3 credits of summer courses. Classes marked with a \* can be taken in the summer. Multiple courses can be taken if a student chooses.

\*\*Internship course: This internship must be taken after all other courses are completed. The number of credits assigned to the internship will depend on the number of credits the student has left to meet graduation requirements. An academic advisor and the Kinesiology internship coordinator will help the student determine how many internship credits to take.

**Graduation term:** If a student is concerned by the difficulty/number of courses listed in each semester, they have the option of moving the internship course to the summer in year four. This would allow the student to take a full load of classes in the spring semester. The student would graduate in the summer term, but participate in the spring ceremony (just as they would if they did their internship in the spring semester).

**Kinesiology and Health graduation requirements:** A minimum of 124 credits must be earned to graduate, with no more than 65 credits applied from a community college. In addition, 46 credits from 300+ coursework must be completed. A Bachelor of Science degree in Kinesiology and Health is awarded upon completion of coursework at Iowa State University.

#### **COURSE SUGGESTIONS**

Students should work with their community college advisor to determine if taking any course below is in their best interest and if they fulfill requirements for their program.
