HOW TO READ THIS TRANSFER PLAN

This guide is designed for students to see how courses taken at a community college will transfer to Iowa State and within the Financial Counseling and Planning major. On the left side, the "Iowa State University Course" is listed and on the right side, the exact match (course equivalent) is shown. If the right side is blank, the student will need to complete the course at Iowa State University.

This transfer plan has <u>3</u> parts

- 1. General Education courses for the FCP major. (Note: an AA/AS degree does not satisfy this requirement. Iowa State will review each course.)
- 2. Required Classes for the FCP Major
- 3. Recommended Electives for the FCP Major.

TRANSFER PLAN NOTES

- Maximum of 65 credits can be transferred to Iowa State University from a community college(s).
- Undergraduates who have a cumulative grade point average of 3.50 at the beginning of their final term are eligible to graduate "with distinction" provided they have completed 60 semester credits of coursework at Iowa State University at the time they graduate, including a minimum of 50 graded credits.
