COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS AND SCIENCES GRADUATION REQUIREMENT FOR WORLD LANGUAGE

LAS students whose first language is English are required to meet college level proficiency in one world language. That requirement can be met by three or more years of high school study in a single world language **OR** by completing the second semester of a college-level world language course. The Department of World Languages and Cultures offers a test-out examination administered each semester. Two semesters of American Sign Language are recognized by Iowa State and will meet the world language requirement. **Students transferring with an AA degree are not exempt from this requirement.**
